#### **Draft Minutes**

#### A. Items Opening Meeting

- 1. Call to Order Mayor ProTem Justin Hamilton called the meeting to order at 6:30 PM.
- 2. Pledge Mayor ProTem Justin Hamilton led the Pledge of Allegiance.
- 3. Roll Call Village Secretary called roll: Present were: Mayor ProTem Justin Hamilton, Councilmember Tex Tubbs, Councilmember Shelly Molina. Absent: Councilmember Mark Maund and Councilmember Cliff McInnis. A quorum was present.

#### **B. Public Comments**

No public comments received.

#### C. Budget Workshop

Councilmember Tex Tubbs made a motion to open discussion. Councilmember Shelly Molina seconded the motion. Council discussed major spending (expense) line items: staff positions and wages were considered, contemplating 5.3% increase as cost of living base line, continuation of part time administrative support; professional fees for Village attorney and engineer.

Trash service, which includes townhouse trash containers billed monthly to the Village and rebilled to townhouse association and received through income received. Contract services for Travis County Sheriff Office with Travis County vehicle use with an increase to annual contract hours by 40 hours for additional coverage through our busy summer months of June, July and August.

Discussion of anticipated premium increase for Village staff health benefits (16-27%) and Village package liability policy (4.8-10%). Staff 'wish list' items discussed. Council direct staff to provide information to expense Village beautification items (rugs and planters at building entrance) and general maintenance and/or recurring supplies for routine upkeep from FY2023 budget if available.

Additional riding mower and second deep freezer not approved at this time. Furnishings for animal kennel space, owned by Travis County WCID, not approved at this time.

Council direct staff to provide approximate cost information to contract for trimming tree branches covering all roadways; present cost to rent equipment and purchase supplies to perform all roadway crack seal with in-house staffing.

- 3. Roll Call Village Secretary called roll: Present were: Mayor ProTem Justin Hamilton, Councilmember Tex Tubbs, Councilmember Mark Maund, Councilmember Shelly Molina. A quorum was present. Councilmember Cliff McInnis arrived at 6:33 PM.

#### B. Public Hearing/Items for Consideration

- 1. Consider testimony and act upon proposed amendments to Chapter 2 of the Zoning Ordinance providing regulations for uses within the Open Space/Parks/Recreational [OSPR] Zoning District.
  - a. Recommendation received to add Use Regulation of Conditional Use (Chapter 10 Sec 1.1.10.1) to Retail Restaurant zoning use summary table (Chapter 2 Sec 1.1.2.2) for O/S/P/R- Open Space/Parks/Recreational Zoning District.
  - b. There were no comments for public hearing. Mayor ProTem Justin Hamilton closed public comments to this item.
  - c. Councilmember Shelly Molina requested Council consideration reviewing whole of Zoning Ordinance to apply updates and amendments in lieu of one or two amendments at a time.
  - d. Councilmember Tex Tubbs made a motion to approve proposed amendment to Chapter 2 of the Zoning Ordinance providing regulations for uses with the Open Space/Parks/Recreational Zoning District and place on July 19 Council agenda for second and final reading. Mayor ProTem Justin Hamilton seconded the motion. Councilmember Mark Maund, Councilmember Cliff McInnis and Councilmember Shelly Molina in favor. Motion carried. Second and final reading July 19, 2023, Council meeting.
- 2. Consider testimony and act upon proposed amendments to Chapters 3, 4, 5, and 6 of the Zoning Ordinance providing regulations and definitions for impervious cover and lot coverage and correcting scrivener's errors.
  - a. Recommendation received to accept addition of definition Impervious Coverage (ai) to more clearly define and amend Chapter 3 definition Lot Coverage (bc), capture amendments to reference of impervious cover and lot coverage Chapters 4, 5 and 6; scrivener's errors noted to yard requirements Chapters 4, 5, and 6.
  - b. Member of P&Z Commission addressed Council regarding this recommendation to define how to measure what is lot coverage other than vague definition of percent of lot covered with structures. This recommendation is presented to define impervious cover, it is not amending or speaking to percent of lot coverage but how lot coverage should be determined. Mayor ProTem Justin Hamilton closed public comments to this item.
  - c. Councilmember Shelly Molina felt this definition was restrictive. Councilmember Shelly Molina was unsure this definition was in the best interests of the Village of Point Venture. Councilmember Shelly Molina voiced her wish for Council consideration to review the Zoning Ordinance in whole to begin updates and amendments.

June 21, 2023

- d. Councilmember Tex Tubbs made a motion to approve proposed amendment to Chapter 3, 4, 5, and 6 of the Zoning Ordinance providing regulations and definitions for impervious cover and lot coverage, correcting scrivener's errors and place on July 19 Council agenda for second and final reading. Councilmember Mark Maund seconded the motion. Mayor ProTem Justin Hamilton, Councilmember Shelly Molina and Councilmember Cliff McInnis opposed. Motion to approve proposed amendments fails.
- C. Mayor ProTem Justin Hamilton convened into Open Session at 6:54 PM.

Resident spoke to situation on Summit Ridge Drive where residents of the Waterford division cross Point Venture empty lot to access Point Venture roads and amenities.

#### E. Mayor Pro-Tem Report

- 1. Blue Santa Project and Village participation no additional report given.
- 2. Point Venture city flag design contest. Get your design in by July 31st and possibly be chosen to have your flag fly as the official village flag.
- 3. Mayor seat is vacant with an unexpired term. Mayor election for full two year term is November 7, 2023. The Village Council may appoint for one vacant Council position until the next general election (November 7, 2023). The Village Council may also operate as a five-member Council until the general election. Councilmember Tex Tubbs in favor of operating as five-member Council. Council discussion of appointment and being transparent by notifying community of vacant Mayor seat for resident interest in the Mayor seat vacancy.

#### F. Travis County Sheriff's Report

Detective Pasak attended Council meeting. There are no new concerns. Summer months do bring more activity to our community. Detective Pasak spoke to noise complaints can and should be reported to Travis County Sheriff dispatch number. On an initial noise complaint Travis County Deputy will visit noise complaint site with a warning. If the noise continues, a second complaint must be reported to initiate possible citation process with Travis County Sheriff Office. Council discussed consideration for additional coverage of 10 hours per month during June, July and August. Detective Pasak felt increased coverage July 1 through Labor Day could be possible if requested. Councilmember Cliff McInnis made a motion to increase Travis County Sheriff contract services 10 hours per month from July through Labor Day. Councilmember Tex Tubbs seconded the motion. All present approved. Motion carried.

#### **ORDINANCE NO. 2023-**

AN ORDINANCE OF THE VILLAGE OF POINT VENTURE, TEXAS, AMENDING CHAPTER 2 OF THE ZONING ORDINANCE OF THE VILLAGE OF POINT VENTURE, TEXAS; PROVIDING RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR DISTRICT CLASSIFICATION OF RESTAURANTS; PROVIDING FINDINGS OF FACT; PROVIDING FOR REPEAL, SEVERABILITY, SAVINGS, PUBLICATION AND CODIFICATION; DETERMINING THAT THE MEETING AT WHICH THIS ORDINANCE IS PASSED IS OPEN TO THE PUBLIC AS REQUIRED BY LAW; PROVIDING A PENALTY; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Village Council of the Village of Point Venture ("Village Council") seeks to provide for the public health, safety and welfare of its citizens; and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to Section 51.001 of the Texas Local Government Code, the Village of Point Venture may adopt and amend ordinances for the good government, peace and order of the Village, as necessary or proper for carrying out a power granted by law to the Village; and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to Section 211.003 of the Texas Local Government Code, the Village of Point Venture has general authority to regulate the location and use of buildings, other structures and land for business, industrial, residential, or other purposes; and

WHEREAS, the Planning and Zoning Commission of the Village of Point Venture and the Village Council have each conducted, in the time and manner and after the notice required by law and the Village of Point Venture Zoning Ordinance, a public hearing on the proposed amendments to the Village of Point Venture Zoning Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, all persons appearing at such public hearings who desired to speak on such proposed amendments were afforded that opportunity and their comments were duly noted and considered; and

WHEREAS, the Planning and Zoning Commission has issued its final report to the Village Council; and

WHEREAS, after due deliberation and consideration of the recommendation of the Planning and Zoning Commission and all other comments and information received at the public hearings, the Village Council concludes that the amendments made by the adoption of this Ordinance are in the best interest of the Village of Point Venture; and

WHEREAS, the Village Council finds that adoption of this ordinance will promote the orderly and safe use of property within the Village; and

### NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE VILLAGE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF POINT VENTURE, TRAVIS COUNTY, TEXAS THAT:

**SECTION 1**. Findings of Fact. All of the above recitals and premises are hereby found to be true and correct legislative and factual findings of the Village Council of the Village of Point Venture, are made a part hereof for all purposes and are hereby approved and incorporated into the body of this Ordinance as if restated in their entirety.

**SECTION 2**. Amendments. The Code of Ordinances of the Village of Point Venture, Texas is hereby amended by adding "Restaurants" as a "Conditional Use" in the OSPR District as provided in Section 1.1.2.2 Zoning Use Summary Table of Chapter 2 of Exhibit A Zoning Ordinance of Chapter 9 to provide as follows:

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#### **SECTION 3. No Vested Interest/Repeal.**

No developer or property owner shall acquire any vested interest in this Ordinance or in any other specific regulations contained herein, which are separate and apart from any vested right granted by Chapter 245 of the Local Government Code. Any portion of this Ordinance may be repealed or amended by the Village Council in the manner provided for by law.

#### **SECTION 4. Repeal.**

This Ordinance shall be cumulative of all other ordinances affecting zoning which are not expressly amended or repealed hereby in accordance with Section 2 above and shall not repeal any of the provisions of such ordinances except for those instances where there are direct conflicts with the provisions of this Ordinance in accordance with Section 2 above. Except as provided in Section 2, ordinances or parts thereof in force at the time this Ordinance that are inconsistent with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent that they are inconsistent with this Ordinance. Provided however, that any complaint, action, claim or lawsuit which has been initiated or has arisen under or pursuant to such Ordinance on the date of adoption of this Ordinance shall continue to be governed by the provisions of that Ordinance and, for that purpose, the Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

#### **SECTION 5. Severability.**

Should any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance be declared unconstitutional or invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, it is expressly provided that any and all remaining portions of this Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect. The Village Council of the Village of Point Venture hereby declares that it would have passed this Ordinance, and each section, subsection, clause or phrase thereof irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections, sentences, clauses and phrases be declared unconstitutional or invalid.

#### **SECTION 6. Savings.**

All rights and remedies of the Village of Point Venture are expressly saved as to any and all violations of the provisions of any ordinances regulating, affecting, or relating to zoning, land use and/or development which have accrued at the time of the effective date of this Ordinance; and, as to such accrued violations and all pending litigation, both civil and criminal, whether pending in court or not, under such ordinances, shall not be affected by this Ordinance but may be prosecuted until final disposition by the courts.

#### **SECTION 7. Publication and Codification.**

The Village Secretary of the Village of Point Venture is hereby directed to publish the Caption, Penalty and Effective Date of this Ordinance as required by Section 52.011 of the Texas Local Government Code. The Village Secretary is further directed to have this Ordinance codified at the next available codification update.

**SECTION 8. Open Meeting.** The Village Council of the Village of Point Venture hereby finds and determines that the meeting at which this Ordinance was adopted was open to the public and that public notice of the time, place and purpose of said meeting was given as required by the Open Meetings Act, Chapter 551 of the Texas Government Code.

#### **SECTION 9. Penalty.**

It shall be unlawful for any person to violate any provision of this Ordinance, and any person violating or failing to comply with any provision hereof shall be fined, upon conviction, in an amount not less than One Dollar (\$1.00) nor more than Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00), in accordance with the enforcement and penalty provisions, and a separate offense shall be deemed committed each day or part of a day during or on which a violation occurs or continues. Further, if the Village Council of the Village of Point Venture determines that a violation of this Ordinance creates a threat to the public safety, the Village may bring suit in the District Court to enjoin such violation and may exercise all available remedies as allowed by law.

#### **SECTION 10. Effective Date.**

That this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its date of passage, in accordance with law, and it is so ordained.
